


Image: Change and Continuity. With Theatre, Information and Technology Suite and Office, Paul Vick architects, 2016. Photo of building: Martin Storey.

Clients ask us why we speak about architecture addressing wider issues. Our lives change. Knowledge and technology alters contexts for those that live and work in the spaces. In architectural terms, if done correctly, more can and should be achieved with less. We gain with improved use of resource and better use of assets. This progress takes innovation, imagination and science to achieve and the understanding of these developments help us. Today, we wouldn't consider most buildings without electric lights or heating - in fact in the West it wouldn't be legal.

Innovation isn't just about creating new technologies. Innovation is the adding of value to knowledge which has broader possibilities. It is a process that includes discovery, understanding, and then use. And innovation can be taking the old and using it in a new way, or taking the new and using it in a familiar way but with additional benefit.

There are a huge number of sources:

Whether learning from still standing Ancient Roman structures which we understand probably better than they did 2000 years ago, to taking information from the satellite Voyager 2 which was launched in 1977. Unmanned, guided from earth, sun and gravity fed for its energy, 39 years and 10 billion miles later it is still sending us information about our universe. Back on earth social needs and demographic trends are watched in real time and with greater precision and understood with new processes such as big data. It is a very exciting time for architecture.
