

The Charity Article 25 (UN Declaration of Human Rights - 'everyone has a right to shelter') is delighted to announce that 10×10 London has returned. 10×10 London is Article 25's main fundraising event. It divides an area of London into a 10×10 grid. The 100 resulting squares are allocated to prominent architects, designers and artists, who create 100 unique artworks, together forming a snapshot of London.



This year's auction is now open and will close in the evening of T 1st Dec. 2015. The theme for this year's event is the Thames, with artists exploring the role the river plays in shaping our city. The 10×10: Drawing the River grid will follow the curvature of the river and take in the incredible variety of architectural landmarks built
